Black people are 13% of our population and 40% of our prisoners are black, this doesn't add up. The reason for this is that if a black person and a white person commit the same crime the black person is much more likely to get arrested. After this, they are also more likely to be convicted than white people. Lastly, they are sent to jail and their sentences are usually longer than white people's are. Currently, up to 13% of black men are restricted from voting.

-The same article also explains that in an experiment that was conducted where four men, two black and two white all applied for jobs. A black man and a white man applied with criminal records while the other two did not. After the experiment, it was observed that both black men received harsh rejection as opposed to the white man. Furthermore, the white man with a criminal record was let down less harshly.
